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1. Introduction

gofanco 8-Port HDMI Extender/Splitter over CAT5e/6 with Loopout - 40M (part# HDMIExt8P) extends 1080p signals to eight monitors over Cat5e/6 up to 40m.

2. Features

- Extends HDMI transmissions up to 40m (130ft) over CAT5e/6/7
- HDCP 1.2 compliant
- Supports 480i/480p/720p/1080i/1080p at 60Hz video resolutions
- Supports up to Digital Stereo 7.1-channel, PCM, DTS, AC3

3. Installation Requirements

- HDMI source device (DVD player, set top box, PC, etc.)
- HDMI display devices (SDTV/Monitor, HDTV/ Monitor, projector, etc.)
- HDMI cables (not included)
- CAT cables (not included)

2	EDID	The HDMI source device reads EDID information from the TX unit, and outputs it to the RXs. Please refer to the settings on Page 6.
3	IR Out	Infrared 3.5mm socket. Plug IR Blaster extension cable here. See instructions on page 13.
4	HDMI In	Connect your HDMl source here with an HDMl cable (cable not included)
5	HDMI Out	Connect your HDMI display here for local monitoring of the HDMI displays
6	RJ45 Out	Link to Receiver's RJ45 In using a Cat5e/6 cable

7. Hardware Installation

Note: To achieve optimal performance, CAT6 cable is recommended.

- 1. Power off all devices including your HDMI source and display.
- 2. Connect your HDMI source to the Transmitter's **HDMI IN** connector.
- 3. Optional: Connect the IR Blaster extension cable to the Transmitter's IR Out. Face the eye towards your HDMI device's IR window.
- Connect your HDMI display to the Receiver's HDMI OUT connector with an HDMI cable (not included). Repeat this step for all Receivers.
- 5. Optional: Connect the IR Receiver extension cable to the Receiver's **IR In**. Repeat this step for all Receivers.
- 6. Switch the **EDID** according to your desired HDMI signal format. Refer to page 6 for details.
- 7. Connect and link the Transmitter and Receivers by CAT5e/6 cables.
- 8. Plug the included power adapters into the Transmitter's and Receivers' **Power Jacks**, then plug all power adapters into reliable power outlets.
- 9. Power on your HDMI device and HDMI displays.
- 10. The HDMI Extender is ready for use.




8. Cat Cable Writing

We suggest both RJ45 connectors be wired identically using T568B wiring standard for the best performance and compatibility.

Both connectors must be wired identically, to T568B standard.





Note: You may use cat5e, cat6 UTP (cat6 preferred) in conjunction with the HDBitT output; however for best performance use cat6a or cat7 (particularly in electrically noisy environments). The maximum distances & transmission performance for HDMI and HDBT may be compromised by cable quality, patch panels, poor termination, wall plates, cable kinks and electrical interferences. Generally ensure the cat cable is solid copper core of 23AWG (avoid CCA type), in one straight run (avoid/minimise patches) and avoid close proximity to any noisy electrical sources.

9. Connection Diagram

Easily extends HDMI signals such as DVD players or computers to four remote displays simultaneously . An ideal solution for exhibitions, video conferences, show centers, and etc.




Figure 5: Connection Diagram

Note: When using the remote control, please make sure its distance to the IR Receiver extension cable is within 5 meters (16.4 ft) and without obstructions.

10. IR Extenders

- **IR Blaster:** Plug into the Transmitter's IR 3.5 socket to emit IR signals.
- **IR Receiver:** Plug into the Receiver's IR 3.5 socket to receive IR signals from a remote control (for the HDMI device connected to the Transmitter).

Note: Incorrect placement of the IR Blaster and IR Receiver may result in failure of these cables. Please check carefully before plugging in the IR cables to proper IR sockets.

11. FAQ & Solutions

Q: There is no picture on the TVs:

- A: 1. Check whether the correct TV input is selected.
 - Check whether the "Link" LED on TX and RXs are on. If the RX's Link LED blinks, it means the RX doesn't receive signals from the TX.
 - 3. Make sure the resolution of the input HDMI source is supported by this Extender/Splitter.

Q: There is unstable picture on the TVs:

- A: 1. Switch the "EDID" to the appropriate position, refer to page 6 for details.
 - 2. Unplug the Cat5e/6 cable and plug in again. If the issue still exists, use other Cat5e/6 cables.

Q: Only one TV has image:

- A: 1. Make sure the CAT cables and HDMI cable are connected correctly and securely.
 - 2. Press the "Reset" button on the TX to re-identify the HDMI signal.
 - 3. Unplug the Cat5e/6 cable and plug in again.
